# Eternally Vigilant Voter - Jaago Voter Jaago

The ritual of general elections is again on the anvil. Democracy is indisputably the best form of Government for any civilized and free society and elections are an important instrument for bringing changes in a peaceful manner in accordance with the aspirations of the people. All this has been possible because of the supreme sacrifices made by the countless freedom fighters for the independence of our country from the oppressive and tyrannical rule of the British imperialists. The country finally got independence in 1947. Of course, this independence brought in its trail the partition of the country on the basis of two-nation theory necessitating migration of millions of people from one place to another resulting in utmost misery and cruelty unprecedented and unheard of in the known history of mankind according to a UN report. This diabolical game plan was a parting kick on the back of the Indian sub continent as part of the divide and rule policy of the British rulers. It is in this background that India has got political independence. Regarding this cherished dream of political independence, it is said that the worst self-rule is better than the best of foreign rule.

Political freedom, however, is not complete unless it is accompanied by social freedom and economic freedom which elude us even after sixty years of our independence. What to talk of ushering in social and economic freedom to complete the process of freedom, unfortunately our political class and their bureaucratic cronies have hijacked even the political independence. The net result is there for anybody to see. 'Swaraj' is all about giving direct control to people over their affairs and funds through their elected representatives for fulfilling their aspirations and redressing their grievances. Thus, for all purposes people are the real masters. They elect their representatives to form a Government to run the affairs of the State and formulate and implement policies and plans in accordance with the aspirations of the people. The bureaucrats are also selected as per a mandate of the people. Being the real masters, people have, ipso facto, the right to recall their elected representatives and summon the officials and punish them, if needed for their non-feasance, mal-feasance, and mis-feasance. The elected representatives and the bureaucrats have failed the people on all fronts because elected representatives and the police do not provide us safety and security from anti-social elements and terrorists and no action is taken against them, Government doctors and hospitals do not provide adequate health care, courts do not give us justice and government schools do not provide education to all and a

majority of the youth do not get employment and the old and the infirm are left to fend for themselves. There is no social security net worth the name. The entire scenario is very grim. The fourth estate, barring a few exceptions, is also indifferent to the real issues facing the society. They are neither playing any constructive role in shaping and moulding public opinion nor acting as watch-dogs of the Government policies. There are roughly fifty-seven million malnourished children in India. Six thousand children die every day on account of mal-nutrition. There are more children dying in India due to NIDS (Nutritional Immune Deficiency Syndrome) compared to Aids. Still Aids which affects only a total of 40 million people all over the world gets all the limelight. What a paradox that while scientists in some developed countries like Australia are working to improve the quality of human brain so that quality of life can be improved, we are not doing anything to save the lives of these children who are the future of our country. Further, 56% of our children do not get any protective vaccination, 40% of them are under-weight, 70% of them are anaemic due to mal-nutrition and two-thirds of our pregnant women are anaemic. Our health care system is prohibitively expensive and is not patient-friendly. The poor can never have access to this system. With such a large medical and paramedical work force, technological advancement in the field of medicine and political will, there is no reason why we should not have an integrated health care system. The people are spending approximately Rs. 10 lakhs on making one qualified doctor. The medical fraternity and people's representatives owe it to the public to put in place a comprehensive health care system for the teeming millions. Ayurveda and Yoga could also be extensively used to take care of the preventive and curative aspects of human ailments. Equally pathetic is the state of education, particularly child education. Over 31.5% of students enrolled at the primary level in India miss their classes to either take care of their siblings or provide helping hand to the family, according to a Government survey. In Delhi alone, 2.42 lakh children do not attend school. The number of children not going to school in the country must be ten times more than the number of children who are going to school. A vast number of these children who should be in class rooms can be spotted near traffic signals, in parks, in dhabas, in households, in business establishments, outside religious places or just idling away their time in their houses or neighbourhoods. Many of these children are forced to resort to drug trafficking, child prostitution and other anti-social activities. What a colossal waste of such a precious national human resource which is being

converted into a big liability rather than asset to the society. The principal reason for this pathetic state of affairs is not so much due to the lack of resources as it is due to our wrong priorities. The other reasons are lop-sided, half-hearted, non-innovative and ill-conceived formulation and implementation of policies. A little innovation and far-sightedness can make a sea change in this regard. The Government agencies quite often harp on the fact that lack of resources stand in the way of compulsory universal and equal primary education but when some individuals or organizations come forward to do their bit for primary education, the Government agencies stipulate some un-workable and not really necessary conditions about space, infrastructure and teaching staff. A lot of well-meaning and educated housewives, senior citizens and other people are found to be teaching in parks, on the raised platforms outside their houses, in parks or some other make-shift arrangements. This ad hoc arrangement will certainly check the onslaught of drug mafia, human traffickers and other anti-social elements entering into the lives of these out-of-school children. Finally a word about the bankruptcy of Government policies in this regard. A huge Government grant has been given for setting up a state-of-the-art school in Delhi which is being run the wives of the top retired bureaucrats for their children. Neither the concerned Minister, nor the elected representatives of the people nor the Auditor and Controller General of India raised an objection as to why such a huge amount of the poor people of the country is being spent on highly privileged handful of people at the cost of the highly deprived sections of the society. Another reason for the pitiable state of child education is the slipshod manner in which even the existing policies for the deprived sections of the people are being implemented. A case in point is the mid-day meal for children where according to a survey of the HRD Ministry, one-third of the food grains meant for the scheme are going waste. The only way to bring the country out of this quagmire on the educational front is to introduce and implement seriously and sincerely without any further delay universal and equal compulsory school education. It is surprising that none of the political parties except perhaps a little known political party with a little presence has been quite vocal about this crucial issue all these years. The much-talked bill on universal compulsory school education which envisages an expenditure of Rs. 2 lakh crore has yet to see the light of the day. If this scheme is implemented sincerely, it will be the soundest public investment in building a strong India with high intellectual dividends and gargantuan social

returns. Regarding the economic freedom, a vast majority of the people are groaning under the scourge of poverty. According to a survey of the National Sample Survey Organization, the per capita monthly income of 25 crore people living below the poverty line is Rs. 356. 30 in rural areas which works out to just Rs. 11.88 per day per person. Most of the economic woes of the country are man-made and are largely due to the faulty planning, lack of midway corrective measures to minimise cost and time overruns. Much more than the resources required for implementation of the welfare schemes for the poor and down-trodden sections of the society is the lack of commitment for the public good on the part of the political elite and their cohorts in bureaucracy who are the biggest stumbling blocks in bringing any worthwhile economic change. As regards our country, global melt-down is affecting only the urban areas. MOUs/Agreements worth Rs. 2.45 lakh crore (Posco and Tata Projects etc) were signed in the past three years but are stuck at various stages due to the specious plea of land acquisition etc. When the economic scenario was so grim, the Government and the bureaucracy were dilly-dallying with one excuse or the other instead of taking bold and quick decisions on these projects. Had work on these projects been commenced, it would have generated direct and indirect employment for a few lakhs of people. Infrastructure is another area which would have a multiplying effect in ushering in prosperity and plenty. In the matter of road transport, we should break up the custom barriers on the roads and also open the roads. At present, there are so many bottlenecks for the truckers. While on the roads, they feel as if they are driving from one country to another.

The last but not the least road block to our economic growth is the corruption which has taken deep roots from the top most ladder to the bottom-most pit. What is most shocking is the amount of bribe being paid by the poorest of the poor viz. 30 crore people living below the poverty line, for getting the State-sponsored fundamental entitlements like a ration card(PDS), for getting registered for the National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (NREG), for admission to a school, for filing a police complaint etc. etc. For these anti-poverty schemes, launched by the Government, people below the poverty line, have to shell out a whopping sum of 883 crore on bribes. Per head spending on bribes works out to Rs. 400/-. Is it not a shame that the bureaucrats and others are not sparing even these highly deprived sections of the society. These figures are based on a survey conducted by the Transparency International and the Centre for Media Studies. The most effective way to

eliminate this menace is to make a beginning from the top and then gradually the mindset of the people should be changed. We have to bring home the point that ultimately corruption neither helps the victim nor the perpetrator of this crime and the country or the society is the biggest loser. Another big fraud or the most anti-national act responsible for the rampant poverty in the country is the black money generated through tax evasions or other frauds and lying in the secret accounts of Indians in the Swiss Banks with the connivance of certain vested interests even though the Indian law does not permit holding of such huge assets abroad. It is also not correct to say that due to the Code of Secrecy of the Swiss Banks, details of these accounts cannot be ascertained. Under certain circumstances is made available to the Governments of other countries. The US Justice Department had succeeded in getting information about the US citizens who had undisclosed assets in the largest Swiss Bank, UBS. If US could do this, what stops us from trying to do so on the same lines. The amount lying in the secret accounts of Indian in Swiss Banks and which rightfully belongs to the poor people of India, is so huge that it is sufficient to wipe out the hunger, disease and poverty of the people of our country to a great extent, if this amount is utilized judiciously. A lot needs to be for achieving social freedom. The society is still sharply divided on caste and sub caste and religious lines. In fact much more than the division on religious lines, the caste factor is a serious stumbling block in achieving the goal of an egalitarian society. Politicians are exploiting the caste factor to the hilt to get votes. A word about division on religious lines. We have a secular constitution but people of all religious denominations are always eager to push the cause of their religion in the social and political life of the country. The word 'secular' has been differently interpreted by different people in different contexts to suit their convenience. Sometimes it is interpreted to mean an 'atheist'. The most appropriate and authentic interpretation in the true spirit of our constitution given by a very renowned and learned judge of the Supreme Court is that our constitution is neither pro-religion nor anti-religion and that religion has no role in the affairs of the statecraft.

Elections will come and go but it is the constitutional, national and sacred duty of the voters not only to cast their votes diligently but also to keep an eternal vigilant eye on the political elite and bureaucracy that they are working in the interest of the nation and for the welfare of the people as ultimately it is the people who are the masters and they must assert themselves in this capacity for their own good and for the good of the country.

## Bahadur Sonekar Has Been Murdered; If proved Untrue, I Shall Leave Politics : Udit Raj

### After Sonekar Now Kalicharan And Dr. Udit Raj Are Targets.

### Why Ms Mayawati Can't take courage to hand over the case to CBI.

On 13th April, 2009 Bahadur Sonekar, IJP candidate from Jaunpur Lok Sabha constituency was murdered. On 8th of April, CO, SO and Chowki in-charge pressurized Bahadur Sonekar to withdraw his candidature from this constituency by calling him repeatedly over his mobile. The deceased Sonekar lodged the complaints to DM, SP and election observers against this harassment and threat to his life. The Chief Electoral Officer, Uttar Pradesh was contacted and was informed about the concern for safety of Sonekar on 10-04-2009. On this day, Dr Udit Raj, president IJP also wrote to CEC New Delhi about the threat to the life of Bahadur Sonekar. On 11 and 12 April, 2009 again DM, SP and election observers were apprised about the looming threat to the life of Sonekar in writing as well verbally. He was found missing from his cot at 3 AM on 13-04-2009 by his family members. The body of Bahadur Sonekar was found hanging from a thickly thorny babool tree at about 6 AM about 700 meters from his house. The police was informed accordingly.

The Director General of Police, ADGP, CB CID and Home Secretary had gone to the media to name this murder a suicide in utter disregard to glaring facts and circumstances enumerated hereunder:-

1. The person who was crying hoarse to the authorities to save his life, how and why should he commit suicide?

2. The chapples of the deceased were found near his cot on which he was sleeping, but his bedding was found at a distance from his cot.

3. Evidently, he was kidnapped and killed by pressing his neck or putting a pillow with force on his mouth to obstruct his breath.

4. The electric connection of the house of the deceased had been disconnected on that fateful night.

5. The younger brother of Bahadur Sonekar received a call from a mobile no 9696248556 on his mobile no9336522007 on 12-04-2009 at 11.29 PM. The caller said that goods be off loaded from the truck. Sonkar family has the

business of fruit and vegetables. No consignment was to be received on that day. Hence his brothers were at home. Apparently, the planning was to finish him in his house itself in absence of his brothers.

6. The deceased was found hanging from a thick and thorny babool tree at a distance of about 700 meters from his house. It is impossible to climb babool tree like this, in fact he was killed first and then his body was hanged using ladder.

7. The news of death of Bahadur Sonekar spread like jungle fire in the constituency and big crowd assembled at the spot of the crime. The uncle of the mafia gang and BSP candidate Shri Dhananjay Singh appeared from the crowd and said that it was a suicide. The crowd attacked and chased him.

8. The postmortem report indicates injuries on head and stomach. This indicates that he was killed before he was hanged from a babool tree.

9. Had he wanted to commit suicide, he would have done it in his house or by jumping into river. There was no necessity for him to climb the thick and thorny babool tree.

10. There was wet soil on his feet. Had he climbed the tree for committing suicide, there would not have been wet soil on his feet. The cloth, the gamsha with which he was found hanging was not his.

11. The DGP in his conference on 19-04-2009 told the media that phone calls were made in connection with election meeting. It is sorry state of affair that DGP does not know that it is not the duty of the police but such information is given by the Returning Officer. It is wrong on the part of DGP that impugned mobile calls by police were made on 09-04-2009, the calls were made on 08-04-2009. 12. Shri Dhananjay Singh is a history sheeter. He is accused in 28 criminal cases including the murder of Director General, Dr Bachi Lal and late Mr Friederic Gomes, the assistant warden of famous Martineer School of Lucknow. Once he carried the award of Rs. 50000 on his head, 13. The investigation of this case was handed over to ADG, CB-CID on 13-04-2009 (the day

murder was committed) who reached Jaunpur on the same day. The two other suspects, Rajkumar and Subhash in this case against whom Sonekar family had given in writing, were found sitting with ADG, CB-CID. These persons should have been arrested in the interest of justice.

14. Dhananjay Singh, Rajkumar and Subhash should have been arrested along with delinquent police officers engineering the murder of our candidate, but no action in this regard has been taken. Even the FIR has not been registered against them.

15. The younger brother of deceased Bahadur Sonekar received threatening call from mobile no 9696248556 on his mobile no 9336522007 on April 23, 2009 at 9.11. When Mohammad Issarar Ullah Siddiqui, our General Secretary of Uttar Pradesh Unit wanted to know as to whom impugned mobile no 9696248556 belonged; he was also threatened. The family members of late Sonekar brought this fact in the knowledge of CB-CID at the time of investigation. The National President, Indian Justice Party also brought this incident in the knowledge of the Superintendent Police, Jaunpur over phone on April 23, 2009. Issarar Ullah Siddiqui lodged a written complaint to Police Station, Hussain Ganj, Lucknow; but police administration has

paid no heed till date.

16. Some armed persons tried to attack at the residence of Shri Kalicharn on 15 th. April, the President of Uttar Pradesh Unit of Indian Justice Party. Evidently the State President Kalicharn and National President of Indian Justice Party are now the targets of Dhananjay Singh and his men. In case the appropriate security is not provided to these two leaders; they may also be murdered and the incident declared as suicide or accident.

17. It is most unfortunate that in our country caste pride and caste consciousness plays very vital role in decision-making and favoritism at bureaucratic and political levels. In this case too, the caste factor has not only caused the murder of a dalit candidate but also has influenced the subsequent investigation in favour of suspect (s) DGP, Shri Vikram Singh, ADG, Padman Kumar are of the same caste.

18. This murder has given bad name to the democratic institution especially when victim, a candidate was crying for his life and police and civil administration willfully behaved indifferently and virtually sided with the suspect (s). The Indian as well as foreign media have taken serious note of this murder and have been constantly reporting till date.

19. The participation in election process is a fundamental

right of a citizen. Our candidate was murdered simply because he was posing electoral threat to mafia leadership. As such, this incident is a blot on the fair name of the democracy in India especially when the world is watching the biggest democracy of the world in election process.

20. The state authorities have taken no initiative to go to the roots of this heinous crime of murder of an innocent and young candidate belonging to the dalit community and contesting from general constituency that caused apparently heart burning to the upper caste Dhananjay Singh. This is because of politically motivated state policy.

Ms Mayawati in her press conference on 20-04-2009 put the blame on S Y Kureshi, a member of Election Commission for partiality. She has shown her hypocrisy; the fact is that Election Commission has done nothing in this case. The Commission merely transferred three police officials on 19 April, 2009 and DM and SP are still intact on their respective seats. This being a political murder the election of Jaunpur should have been countermanded. The candidates of Indian Justice Party in the state feel threatened. The state government should be dismissed and President's rule should be imposed. The IJP demands the CBI investigation into the murder of Bahadur Sonekar.
