Brothers and Sisters,

The sacred Nirvan Sthali (place of death) of our Messiah, Architect of the Indian Constitution and Bharat Ratna Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar is located in Delhi, the capital of our country and is directly under the control of the Government of India. Due to years' of callous neglect and isolation the place is in a very dilapidated shape even though it is directly under the control of the Government of India. On the other hand, Samadhis of other national leaders have been made on a grand scale which are always glowing and kept spruced up where the world leaders, during their visits to India, are specially taken for paying floral tributes. Discrimination in this regard has become so acute that there is not even a semblance of dignity, respect and upkeep attached to the place commensurate with the stature of the great son of India, Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar nor are any programmes held in his memory. There are four very important places connected with the life and works of Dr. Ambedkar – Mhow (Madhya Pradesh), place of birth, Nagpur (Maharashtra), Deeksha Bhoomi and Mumbai, Chaitya Bhoomi and Delhi, the sacred Nirvan Sthali. While lakhs of people assemble at three places to participate in a variety of programmes, the Nirvan Sthali at Delhi is lying in neglect and isolation.

# ANOTHER RUPEES 700 CRORE DDA SCAM: OPEN LOOT IN THE NAME OF COMMONWEALTH GAMES

New Delhi, October 8, 2009.

Dr. Udit Raj, Chairman, All India Confederation of SC/ST Organizations and National President, Indian Justice Party, that hardly the ink on the DDA flat allotment scam had dried, another DDA scam involving Rs. 700 crore has appeared on the surface. This scam has its roots in the auction of a 68-acre plot way back in 2007. Reserve price of the plot was fixed at Rs. 300 crore and the final bid was struck at just Rs. 321 crore in favour of a private builder, EMRMGI. This

amount was to be paid by the builder in the form of 389 flats, ranging from two to five bed rooms, at an average price of Rs. 82 lacs per flat. The builder was dragging his feet in the timely completion of the flats and started giving lame excuses with some ulterior motives. Finally he came out with the plea that due to financial constraints, he could not meet his obligations and informed DDA accordingly. Dr. Udit Raj said that instead of invoking penalty clauses and pressuring the builder to adhere

to the schedule which was so very crucial for the Commonwealth Games, the DDA top brass came up with a bail out plan to help the builder and themselves ostensibly in the name of Commonwealth Games. He further said that under this bail-out plan, DDA decided to purchase additional 333 flats at a total cost of Rs. 700 crore and gave an advance of Rs. 350 crore immediately to the builder and another Rs. 100 crore has been promised to be released during October 2009 even when the

earlier project is way behind schedule. It is pertinent to mention here that according to the bail-out plan, cost of each flat in the second phase works out to Rs. 2.10 crore whereas in the earlier phase, the cost of each flat was just Rs. 82 lacs. Dr. Udit Raj said that it is surprising that a party which has miserably failed in its contractual obligations is being further loaded with additional work and is also being given huge advance amount. There is no guarantee that a builder who has failed to deliver

the goods will not do so again particularly at a time when our national prestige is involved in the timely completion of the project for the Commonwealth Games. In the end Dr. Udit Raj said that while he would very much like that the housing project for the Commonwealth Games should be completed well before the time, at the same time he would like that an enquiry should be held into this shady deal so that the public funds are not allowed to be squandered and the guilty are punished. ✦✦✦

## Justice P. D. Dinakaran And Dr. Jagdish Prasad Are Victims Of Caste Bias

New Delhi, September 27, 09.

Dr. Udit Raj, Chairman of the All India Confederation of SC/ST Organisations & National President of Indian Justice Party, said that Justice P.D. Dinakaran is a victim of caste bias. Recently, Shri Shanti Bhushan, Senior Advocate alleged that the Chief Justice of India, Justice K.G. Balakrishnan is favouring Justice Dinakaran on caste lines. It is to be noted that Justice Dinakaran is likely to be promoted as Judge of the Supreme Court. Allegations of corruption against him have started pouring just when he is likely to be elevated to the post of Supreme Court Judge and not before. He has been Chief Justice of the Karnataka

High Court for years. The Chief Justice of India, Justice K.G. Balakrishnan himself was victimized but the then President of India, Shri K.R. Narayanan intervened otherwise today he would not have been holding the post of the Chief Justice of India.

Dr. Udit Raj said that Dalits are rather disappointed from the Chief Justice of India because he has not inducted people from SC/ST/OBCs and Minorities into the Supreme Court and High Courts. Thus, the remark of Shri Shanti Bhushan is totally unjustified and biased and it attracts the provisions of the SC/ST Atrocities Act against him. The lighter punishment for his remark could be that he

should tender a public apology for his derogatory and caste-biased remarks.

Dr. Udit Raj said that the Judges of the High Courts and the Supreme Court are mainly from the so-called upper castes and their kith and kin. Had it not been so, representation of people from SC/ST/OBCs would also have been there. There are very few Judges in the High Courts and the Supreme Court who have merit and rest of them are there because of nepotism and caste equation. This is very unfortunate that even higher judiciary is not free from casteism. Dr. Udit Raj said that another case of victimization is of a senior Dalit doctor of

Safdarjung Hospital. Dr. Jagdish Prasad was the most competent Medical Superintendent that the Safdarjung Hospital ever had. He has been removed on a flimsy ground that a couple of contractors had lodged FIR against him for demanding money in lieu of tender acceptance. The money mentioned in the FIR is huge compared to the economic capacity of the bidders. Dr. Udit Raj said that it seems that the contractors have been touted to file FIR against Dr. Jagdish

Prasad and get him removed. The post of Medical Superintendent is such a senior position that without an enquiry or substantial charges, Dr. Jagdish Prasad should not be removed like this and thus it is also a case of victimization. He urged the Government to intervene in both these matters otherwise there will be a growing feeling among dalits that they are becoming more and more vulnerable to caste bias. ✦✦✦

## Mukti Prakash Tirki Appointed National Secretary of Indian Justice Party and Kamarauddi Siddiqui Appointed National General Secretary Of Minority Cell

New Delhi, October 5, 09.

Dr. Udit Raj, National President, Indian Justice Party, appointed Shri Mukti Tirki as National Secretary & Election Observer of Jharkhand and Shri Kamarauddin Siddiqui as National General Secretary of Minority Cell of Indian Justice Party.

Shri Mukti Prakash Tirki was born in the tea gardens area of West Bengal in a political family. His father, Shri Piyush Tirki was elected five times to the Lok Sabha from Alipur Duar. He had started taking active part in politics right from his student days. For a long time, he was holding senior positions in the Congress Party in Jharkhand. Till recently, he was holding the post of Secretary in the NREGA Consultative Committee of the Congress Party. He is also the Editor of a monthly magazine "Dalit-Adivasi Duniya" published from Delhi. Shri Tirki said that from the very beginning he wanted to work for getting social justice and dignity to Dalits and Adivasis. He said that he could not achieve these objectives by continuing in the Congress Party and as such had decided to join the Indian Justice Party so that he could work effectively to achieve these goals.

Born in Azamgarh, Uttar Pradesh, Janab Kamaruddin Siddiqui has been working for justice, human rights and dignity

for the oppressed people since 1996. For the protection of human rights, he set up International Human Rights Protection Council. He is Editor and Publisher of a monthly Hindi magazine "Gullistan". He has set up a Trust in the name and style of "Khawaja Garib Nawaz Educational Trust" for the education of the poor and deprived children of the minority community and has been striving hard for the people of the minority community to join the main stream of the society. Shri Siddiqui said that he found that it was not sufficient that people read and appreciate the issues raised in his editorials. The important thing is that people should come forward to give a practical shape to these views. He said that it is possible to do so only by joining a political forum. With this objective in view, he has decided to join the Indian Justice Party.

Dr. Udit Raj said that at this point of time, there is a wide spread frustration among Dalits, Adivasis and Minorities. In the previous tenure of the UPA Government, the Reservation Act should have been enacted but this did not happen and even during the current tenure, this job has not been accomplished by the UPA Government. He said that recruitments are not taking place against vacant posts. For this purpose, a strong movement will

be launched immediately. Dr. Udit Raj said that very soon a Convention of National leaders and workers will be held in New Delhi where a strategy will be worked as to how to achieve our goal of introducing reservation in the private sector. Dr. Udit Raj further said that prices of commodities of daily use have gone so high that life of a common man become miserable. All the problems are showing their head because of the weak-kneed policies of the Government. Farming is rapidly becoming a losing concern. The need of the hour is to make policies which aim at working for the welfare and prosperity of the rural people and conditions are made easy for doing business in the cities so that people can earn their livelihoods without any obstacles. ✦✦✦

anti-nationalist. After returning from the Round Table Conference, he himself said in a public meeting. "At present I am most hated man by the caste Hindus but I may tell you that when, after the dust settles down and the future historians evaluate impartially the activities of the Round Table Conference, the future generations of Hindus will below trumpets in praise of my services to the nation".

11. He further said – "only for the good of the country, I have been working all my life with all sincerity, integrity and energy. Not a single moment I have spent on any other interest than good of the country. In the Round Table Conference too, I was always 200 miles ahead of Mr. Gandhi in all matters relating to love and loyalty for our motherland". He loved his country so much.

12. Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia, a great socialist leader and freedom-fighter, was a great supporter of the views of Baba Saheb. Once he said in the Parliament – "Dr. Ambedkar

occupies a unique place in the political field of India. He is a great scholar, honest, bold and independent Indian. If an example of India's self-pride was to be eer produced before the world – he could be presented for one there".

13. Shri Vishwa Nath Das, former Governor of Uttar Pradesh, once said in a public meeting- "Dr. Ambedkar was so bold and brave that whosoever spoke any derogatory word against India, in the country or outside the country, he would at once stand up to oppose him strongly and vehemently".

14. Much hurt by adverse comments and reviles of his opponents and adversaries, he used to lament sometime saying – " I am most misunderstood today in any my country. But 100 years after my death, people will understand by calling me the greatest nationalist".

15. To conclude – he was every inch a great nationalist and one of the greatest sons of India. ✦✦✦

## Dr. Udit Raj's Short Sojourn to Russia and Ukraine

## Nepal's Stand On Caste In UN Is Welcome

New Delhi, September 30, 09.

Dr. Udit Raj, the Chairman of the All India Confederation of SC/ST Organizations, congratulated Nepal Minister, Jeet Bahadur Darjee Gautam who welcomed the idea of UN Human Rights Council to include the caste discrimination in the draft Principles and Guidelines published four months back. Dr. Udit Raj said that in the year 2001, United Nations had a World Conference against Racism, Racial Discrimination, Xenophobia and related intolerances. Lots of Dalit organizations participated in the Conference and the caste issue got sensitized. The Conference began from 31 August till 8th

September, 2001, and hectic lobbying with international NGOs and Govts. of different countries was done and as a result, the Human Rights Commission accepted the caste discrimination so that it could be eliminated with global effort. The Government of India at that time had opposed it on the ground that there was no discrimination in India on caste lines. The present Chief Minister of Jammu & Kashmir who was at that time External Affairs Minister in the Government of India opposed in the Conference that the Indian Constitution does not allow discrimination on caste lines. What a poor argument was offered, while according to Indian National Bureau of Crime Report

(2006), 27070 crimes were committed against Dalits, though many go unreported. 13 Dalits are murdered, 5 Dalits homes are burnt and 6 Dalits are abducted every week, 3 Dalit women are raped every day and 11 Dalits are beaten every day and a crime is committed against a Dalit every 18 minutes, says Dr. Udit Raj. In spite of Government of India's opposition, the caste discrimination was accepted but under a different terminology "discrimination based on work and descent". Dr. Udit Raj questioned as to how is it possible to hide such a big issue when there is a revolution in communication. Durban Conference review was done

from 20th to 24th April, 2009, in Geneva. Unfortunately, caste discrimination was not discussed but support from the Nepal Government now will facilitate the cause. It seems that Nepal Government is quite realistic and influence of communism cannot be undermined. On 16th September in Geneva, Jeet Bahadur Darjee Gautam supported the view of Human Rights Council that it must be fought globally. This is a courageous stand and if the Nepal Government follows such courageous policies on the domestic front, a day will come when it will leave India behind. Unfortunately, both the BJP and the Congress Parties are together

on this issue and are very keen that it should not be globalized. Their intention is not to do away with the caste system. Caste perpetuation will ultimately hamper the overall development of the country. If we would have been effective to eliminate the caste discrimination, there was not need to seek global support like UN. Once the general house of UN adopts it, not only the UN aid but also international NGOs including European Parliament etc. will be catalyst to fight the menace of caste discrimination. All India Confederation of SC/ST Organizations has decided to wage a struggle in this regard so that Government of India should not block it. ✦✦✦

## Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar (a great Nationalist)

Some critics of Baba Saheb Ambedkar say that since he did not go to jail during the freedom-struggle of India, he was not as nationalist as Mahatma Gandhi, Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and others. This is not correct. Going to jail alone should not be the sole consideration for being called a nationalist. History tells that many great nationalists of the world never went to jail. Baba Saheb's reply to this criticism used to be that he was fighting double slavery, one against the British rule and second against the slavery of the caste Hindus over down-trodden Hindus called shudras, Dalits, untouchables and the likes. Unless and until the Dalits are freed from the slavery of the caste Hindus, political freedom from the British rule is meaningless to the down-troddens of this country. Moreover caste Hindus have many leaders to fight against the British-slavery whereas the poor Dalits had only one leader in Baba Saheb Ambedkar to fight for them. After studying Baba Saheb's life, thoughts and acts in totality, it becomes crystal clear that he was one of the greatest nationalists India ever produced – nationalist par excellence.

2. During the freedom struggle of India, the British rulers convened Round Table Conference with Indian Leaders three times between 1930 and 1932 (A.D.) at London to solve the issue of the freedom to India. Its first meeting in 1930 was however, not attended by the Congress leaders but the

subsequent two meetings were attended by all the Congress leaders (including Mahatma Gandhi) invited there. Baba Saheb was also invited to the conference and he did attend all the three meetings as the representative of the Dalits (down-troddens) of India. In that conference the congress leaders were pleading for a Dominion status only for the country whereas Baba Saheb was demanding completing freedom from the British rule "India cannot progress properly", he said, "unless full freedom is granted to us". The British rulers were so much surprised and afraid to hear him that the security at his hotel was very strongly strengthened, while some Britishers started saying that he was either a terrorist or communist as the world was much scared of the terrorists and the communists those days. That showed how bold and fearless nationalist he was. 3. Baba Saheb used to feel much pained from the people saying, "First I am Indian and thereafter a Hindu or Muslim or Sikh or Christian or Parsi etcetra". This was not acceptable to him. Commitment to being Indian, according to him, is much above the commitment to religion, culture, language and community. He said – "I would like that our countrymen be Indian first and till last remain Indian – none other than Indian. This feeling should be generated among all Indian communities

which is the prime need of the country today".

4. Dr. Ambedkar was very bold and frank in denouncing the rigid caste system called "Varnavyavastha" sincke it was regarded a big hurdle in the path of the nationalism. Very often he used to say – "This belief, in my opinion, is misleading that we are a nation. He can those be one nation who are divided into thousands of castes? It would be better if we could realie at the earliest that in the social and psychological context of the nationalism, we are no nation as yet. Hence I appeal to all countrymen to renounce the casteism that has divided us, creating hatred and jealousy in our society and thereby become one nation".

5. Baba Saheb Ambedkar was a man of very strong and straight views on the issues of casteism, nationalism, religion, national pride and self-respect. Therefore, differences of opinion between and many caste-Hindu-leaders were naturally obvious on these issues. These differences, however, did not deter him from his profound love and passion for the mater-land. Sometimes he used to say publicly in this regard – "I admit that I have dispute with the caste-Hindus on certain issues but I swear by God that I will never hesitated to sacrifice my life for the securioty and honour of my mother-land".

6. Neta Ji Subhas

Chandra Bose impressed him very much when he formed the Indian National Army and led a war in collaboration with the Japanese forces against the allied forces of Britain, U.S.A. and Russia in the north eastern sector of India. They also achieved considerable success initially by conquering Burma and certain other parts of India in that sector. He used to say very often that India got freedom because of Subhash Chandra Bose who fought war against the British forces. As for Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar he also fought against the British Raj for the freedom of the country in his own way. He used to say in this context in his public meetings that I don't lag behind any other leader in the freedom-struggle but I also want freedom of my community along with that of India.

7. Certain hard critics of Dr. Ambedkar used to say that he was an enemy of Hindu caste-system, Hindu culture and Hindi religion. BNut this was not entirely correct. In fact, he was all for reforms in Hindu religion and Hindu culture by renouncing the evils thereof like caste system, untouchability and slavery of the downtrodden Hindus by the caste IHindus. Madhu Limaye, the renowned writer and socialist thinker was his contemporary who wrote the following about him. "Baba Saheb Amedkar had depthless love and passion for his country and Hindu culture in his heart. And he was full to the brim, of national pride and self-respect. He was, however, of strong

conviction that unless the traditional Hindu culture was purified totally – the future of our national would not be bright".

8. Dr. Ambedkar always said that renunciation of casteism only is real nationalism whereas casteism is the worst form of communalism. Nationalism, according to him, has been a very powerful force in the history of humanity. This is a feeling of unity and integrity of a nation not related to any particular class or community. He further added that nationalism in the national context, means a strong feeling of social un ity and in the international context, brotherhood should be the basis thereof.

9. Baba Saheb Ambedkar was a great optimist about the future of India. Very often he used to say – " If many countries of the world, notwithstanding their differences on the issues of caste, religion, language and culture, could function as a nation in an organized and self-governed manner, then why can't India do the same<" He was so hopeful.

10. Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar was the most committed leader of the downtroddens (Dalits) of India. He never minced words in ciriticizing the political parties and the leaders thereof including Mahatma Gandhi on finding their policies and acts against the interests of his people - the downtroddens. That is why he was found unpopular among the caste Hindus so much so that many staunch Hindu leaders started hating and called him
